



5. Distribution of Editorial Board Members




APM has 77 Editorial Board Members from 18 countries. Among them, 49% from USA, 12% from Canada, 6% from UK.


6. Number of Published Articles (results by year)

7. Diverse Types of Articles Published in 2019




During 2019, APM has published **108** manuscripts, among which there are **82** Original Articles, Review Articles and Case Reports.

8. International Diversity of Corresponding Authors in 2019




Corresponding authors of 108 articles published in 2019 come from 17 countries. Among them, 39% comes from USA and 8% comes from Canada.

The "Others" section includes countries like Australia, The Netherlands, France, Japan, Belgium and etc.




9. Citations of APM (results by year)


