




- The 1<sup>st</sup> English journal dedicated to VATS in international community

#### 3. VATS Editorial Board Members




VATS has **64** Editorial Board Members from **15** countries. Among them, 25% from USA, 25% from Italy and 15% from Japan etc.

A total of 64 Members



# 5. Diverse Types of Published Articles in 2019




VATS altogether has published 189 articles since its launch in 2016, including 26 in 2019, with diverse article types.





# 6. International Diversity of Corresponding Authors




Corresponding authors of the 26 articles published in 2019 come from different countries and areas with the majority from USA, Italy, and China.






